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Statement of Board Responsibilities

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Section 51 of that Act requires the ETB to keep in such form and in respect of such accounting periods as may be approved by the Minister for Education with the consent of the Minister for Finance and Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, all proper and usual accounts of the monies received or expended by it.

In preparing those accounts, the Board is required to:

- (a) apply the standard accounting policies for the preparation of ETB financial statements
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- (c) disclose and explain any material departures from the standard accounting policies

The Board is responsible for keeping proper books of account which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Board and which enable it to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with section 51 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. The Board is also responsible for safeguarding its assets and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board Statement on Internal Control

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board came into being on 1st July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. On that date, Kildare and Wicklow ETB took over the Assets, Liabilities and functions of the former Vocational Education Committees of County Kildare and County Wicklow. With effect from 1st January 2014, Kildare and Wicklow ETB took over from SOLAS, the assets, liabilities and the management of the activities of their Training Centre/s.

The Code of Governance for ETBs is set out in Circular Letter 002/2019, which was issued by the Department of Education to all ETBs in January 2019. The Code of Governance was adopted by Kildare and Wicklow ETB at its April 2019 meeting.

The Board for Kildare and Wicklow ETB was constituted in July 2019, and subsequently established Finance and Audit and Risk Committees.

Responsibility for the System of Internal Control

As Chairperson of Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board, I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board to provide oversight of an efficient, effective and economic system of internal controls is maintained and operated. The system can only provide reasonable, and not give absolute assurance, that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period.

Key Control Procedures

Kildare and Wicklow ETB have taken steps to ensure an appropriate control environment by:

- Clearly defining management and staff responsibilities.
- Establishing procedures for reporting significant control failures and ensuring appropriate corrective actions.
- Establishing a formal risk management system involving procedures for identifying and evaluating all
 risks which could prevent Kildare and Wicklow ETB achieving its objectives.

The system of internal control operated in Kildare and Wicklow ETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures.
- Segregation of duties.
- Specific authorisations.
- Internal checks.
- Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by the ETB.

The Boards Oversight Framework includes:

The Board's monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal controls is informed by:

- The Chief Executive who has responsibility for the internal control framework.
- Recommendations made by the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General in management letters or other reports.
- Recommendations made by the Internal Audit Unit ETBs
- Work of the Audit and Risk Committee and the Finance Committee.

Audit and Risk Committee

The Board's oversight of the system of internal control is informed by the work of Audit and Risk Committee (ARC) who met six times in 2021. The work programme of the ARC included consideration of:

- Internal audit reports
- External audit reports and the management letters of the Comptroller and Auditor General (C & AG)
- Draft Annual Financial Statements
- Statement of Internal Control and Letter of Representation
- Risk Management Framework, including risk registers

- Risk Register
- Audit Register
- Reports from Executive on material matters
- Opinion report to the board as to the adequacy and appropriateness of the systems of internal control

The Chief Executive, Director of OSD, Director of FET, and Director of Schools, and the Head of Finance, met with the Audit and Risk Committee in 2021 and/or 2022.

The Audit and Risk Committee reviewed the effectiveness of the system of internal controls for the relevant reporting period on 15th March 2022.

Finance Committee

The Board's oversight of the system of internal control is also informed by the work of Finance Committee who met five times in 2021. The work programme of the Finance Committee included consideration of:

- Service Plan implementation
- Draft Annual Financial Statements 2021 (AFS)
- Recommendation to the Board of draft AFS 2021
- Monthly Income and Expenditure Accounts
- Payments in excess of €25,000
- Contracts register
- Leasing/licencing arrangements

The Chief Executive, Director of OSD and Head of Finance reported to the Finance Committee in 2021.

The Finance Committee reviewed the annual report of the Audit and Risk Committee containing their opinion on the effectiveness of internal control and draft Annual Financial Statements 2021 on 16th March 2022 and recommended their adoption to the Board.

Internal Audit

An internal audit service is provided by the Internal Audit Unit-Education and Training Boards (IAU-ETB), who provide an overall opinion on areas audited. The overall opinion is based on the findings identified during the audit and the range of possible opinions is as follows:

Comprehensive: System of internal control is adequate and operates effectively.

Adequate: System of internal control is generally adequate and operates effectively.

Inadequate: System of internal control is inadequate and does not operate effectively.

The following internal audit reviews were carried out in the period from the 01 January 2021 - 31 December 2021;

An audit of the DEIS programme was commenced in November 2020 and the finalised report was received from IAU-ETBs in April 2022 and presented to the Audit and Risk Committee on 19th May 2022. The overall finding of the Report was that there was an adequate system of Controls in place. A total of 5 recommendations were made – 1 high, 2 medium and 2 low. KWETB is in the process of implementing the recommendations.

An audit of Local Training Initiatives was commenced in October 2020 and at time of completing the SIC 2021, a final audit report was outstanding. An audit of the School Meals Programme was commenced in September 2021 and at the time of completing the SIC 2021, a final audit report was outstanding.

An audit of Youth Services was commenced in November 2021 and at the time of completing the SIC 2021, the audit was still ongoing.

Kildare and Wicklow ETB maintain an *Audit Register*, capturing all audit recommendations and tracking their implementation, the register is reviewed regularly by the ARC.

Breaches of system internal control Procurement-

Kildare Wicklow ETB is continuing to work towards meeting all its responsibilities in respect of procurement regulations and requirements. There are instances where goods and services are procured across over 50 sites through competitive procurement processes, in line with KWETB's Procurement Policy, but the cumulative value across all sites exceeds National/EU tendering thresholds.

Based on analysis of 2021 expenditure in areas where an organisation- wide eTenders process is appropriate, expenditure totalling €1,235,494 (ex. VAT), 3% of overall spend has been identified as non-compliant as follows:

- (i) Expenditure of €564,932, from January to December 2021, for the provision of Recruitment Agency Services to supply fixed term and Temporary Agency Staff throughout KWETB. A tender competition was run in 2022 and a new framework was put in place in Q2 2022.
- ii) Expenditure of €125,260 which is for one supplier for the provision of IT managed services and print services. This supplier held 2 x print management contracts: one contract expired in Q3 2021 and was transferred to our Manged Print Services Contract, the 2nd contract expired in Q3 2022 and the process of transferring the contract is ongoing. A new contract for the provision of ICT Managed Services control was also put in place in Q3 2022, following a complex tendering process.
- (iii) Expenditure of €120,252 for billing of voice and data, network carriers, both mobile and landlines. The OGP has launched a new framework and we will be tendering to this framework in 2023.
- (vi) Expenditure of €84,030 for catering supplies and school meals, one contract is now in place and others tendered and scheduled for evaluation stage in Q1 2023.
- (vi) Expenditure of €67,383 for IT Equipment 2 suppliers for IT & AV Equipment. Contracts in place both IT and AV addressing with budget holders to switch to contracted suppliers.
- (v) Expenditure of €65,996, is (2 suppliers) for school books (Primary School where current contract is in place for Post Primary) and Exam papers. KWETB has now put a new Mock Exam Papers framework in place and we will explore the inclusion of primary school books in the ETB school books framework.

(iv)Expenditure of €64,315 for Bus Hire – comprising of 2 bus companies, both currently in contract signing stage. A new bus hire framework is now in place.

(vii) Expenditure of €143,326 paid to several suppliers, across a range of goods and services including Managed Print contracts working through end of term conditions, security systems, postage and contract cleaning. Managed print is currently being switched to contracted supplier. We are planning tenders for contract cleaning and postage/franking in 2023.

KWETB has developed a Corporate Procurement Plan for 2022, which sets out actions to address areas of identified non-compliance and other KWETB procurement needs. KWETB will continue to monitor and review all areas of expenditure to identify opportunities where tendering and the utilisation of existing National Frameworks for goods and services will provide best value for money and meet compliance requirements.

Non-effective Expenditure

A 10-year lease on an industrial unit was commenced in June 2017, preceded by a one year licence, with the intention of providing electrical apprenticeships, other training courses and office spaces. The fitout was

commenced which enabled some training to take place. The premises was reviewed and was considered unsuitable for further development without considerable financial investment. For a period it was used for storage and ICT disaster recovery. KWETB exited the lease in 2022. The costs associated with the industrial unit up to 31/12/2021 were €763,307. The additional costs incurred in 2022 was €85,178 which includes a lease exit fee of €50,000. The savings resulting from the early exit were €348,155.

Fraud

One, low risk, non-financial, indiscretion that could be construed as fraud under the Anti-Fraud and Corruption policy was reported in 2021. Internal controls were adjusted to ensure the indiscretion is not repeated. There was no financial or material impact on either party. No further action is anticipated.

Protected disclosures

Kildare and Wicklow ETB received no protected disclosures in 2021 under the Protected Disclosure Act 2014

Risk Management

Kildare and Wicklow ETB operates a robust risk management framework across the ETB, underpinned by KWETB's Risk Management Policy. Enhancements to the ETBs risk management framework continue to be made in line with best practice. Risk registers are in place for Corporate, OSD, FET, Schools and at a functional level. They are reviewed at regular intervals. The Audit and Risk Committee review and advise on registers at regular intervals. Risk Management is also a standing item on the Board agenda.

Issues progressing at Sectoral level

Breaches of system internal control - Single Public Services Pension Scheme

Circular Letter 11/2014 obliges ETBs to provide benefits statements and calculations to members of the Single Public Services Pension Scheme by end of June 2014. KWETB did not meet its obligations to provide annual pension statements to all members of the Single Public Service Pension Scheme in 2021. However, statements are being provided to members where they request them individually and statements for staff members nearing retirement are being prioritised. This is an issue across the ETB sector and is being pursued at national level by the ESBS area of the Department of Education in conjunction with ETBI and individual ETBs. Due to resourcing issues with The Access Group, (including Covid-19 and staff leaving) development work which had commenced on the CoreHR System, with a view to bringing ETBs into compliance in relation to Superannuation Contributions, through full system compliance was not completed on schedule. However, a significant amount of work has been undertaken and there is ongoing correspondence with the Access Group and ESBS and testing of the new functionality being provided by Access Group is being conducted. This forms part of the overall Pensions Improvement Programme being implemented by the Department of Education and a dedicated team in ESBS has been put in place which is working solely on resolving Pension and Superannuation Contribution matters. The provision of accurate benefit statements to SPS pension scheme members is an integral part of the scope of this Pensions Improvement Programme.

Payroll Shared Services

The Education Shared Business Service (ESBS) has been established to deliver shared services for the Education and Training sector.

Payroll

The migration of Kildare and Wicklow ETB payroll to ESBS for all staff took place in November 2021. The ESBS is responsible for the processing of the payroll while KWETB is still responsible for the issuing of instructions to shared services of the changes to payrolls and HR function. The Chief Executive has confirmed that she has fulfilled her responsibilities in relation to the requirements of both the Memorandum of Understanding and also the Service Management Agreement that has been signed and is in place between Kildare and Wicklow

ETB and the Department of Education - Education Shared Business Service (ESBS) centre. These documents provide the framework for the operation of ESBS-ETB Payroll Shared Services on behalf of the ETB sector. The Chief Executive relies on a letter of assurance from the Accounting Officer of the Department of Education that appropriate controls are exercised in the provision of payroll services by the ESBS to Kildare and Wicklow ETB

Expenses including Travel and Subsistence

Processing of expenses including Travel and Subsistence (T&S) payments is also transitioning to ESBS during 2022 and 2023. A schedule is being developed for ETBs to migrate Expenses to ESBS during 2022 and 2023 to include Kildare and Wicklow ETB.

Apprentice payroll

Kildare and Wicklow ETB have transitioned their apprentice payroll to ESBS managed payroll service in August 2020.

Learner payments

Kildare and Wicklow ETB have transitioned their learner payments to the managed service set up by ESBS in two waves. Wave 1 in August 2020 and Wave 2 (Youthreach and VTOS) February 2022.

Finance Shared Services

The Education Shared Business Service (ESBS) has been established to deliver shared services in the Education and Training sector with a focus on delivering payroll and finance shared services for ETBs in the first instance. On the 1st July 2022, Kildare and Wicklow ETB, went live on Sun Financials v6.4 and DCS P2P, replacing their existing ESI Manser system, as part of a project to consolidate the existing financial management systems in use in the sector.

Covid-19 Pandemic

The ongoing Covid-19 pandemic in 2021 resulted in continued measures to monitor and mitigate the effects of Covid-19 including maintaining safety and public health measures for our staff, student participants and beneficiaries such as social distancing and working from home.

Notwithstanding the impact of the ongoing pandemic, Kildare and Wicklow ETB continues to carry out its vital role in education and training with a focus on ensuring continuity of education for learners, including a particular focus on more vulnerable students.

The impact of the ongoing pandemic on the ETBs control environment was considered during the review of internal control and assisted by the completion of the *Audit Insights Questionnaire* from the OCAG.

Assessments of the impact of Covid-19 were carried out and the results are as follows;

- Plans were put in place to ensure that operations continued as normal in line with regulatory requirements;
- The Corporate Risk Register includes risks associated with specifically the impact of the pandemic and details relevant mitigating actions;
- Measures have been put in place to support and protect staff, students and public;
- Public health guidelines are followed at all times;
- Integrity of internal control not compromised.

Annual Review of Controls

Kildare and Wicklow ETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. I confirm that the Audit and Risk Committee at its meeting on the 15th March 2022, completed their

review of the effectiveness of the system of internal financial control for year ended 31 December 2021 in the manner prescribed by the Code of Practice for the Governance of Education & Training Boards. This included:

- The Executive presented a report of its review of controls (both verbally and by written report) at its meeting of 15th March 2022. The Audit and Risk Committee received confirmation from the Chief Executive that on balance the system of internal control is adequate and appropriate. The Chief Executive based this statement on information gathered from senior managers across the organisation;
- A review of internal and external audit reports issued in 2021 and to date in 2022, met with representatives from the C&AG and the IAU-ETB, along with an examination of minutes of meetings of the Board and Finance Committee to ensure there are no inconsistencies in these with the assessment of internal control provided to the Audit and Risk Committee in Internal Audit Reports and Management representations;
- The Audit and Risk Committee presented a report (verbally and by written report) on the review of controls to the Board on 22nd March 2022;
- A review of Governance and Control activities in 2021 including:
 - o Engagement between the Audit and Risk Committee, Finance Committee, Board and the executive
 - Reports from the Chief Executive, Director of Organisation Support and Development (OSD),
 Director of Schools and Director of Further Education and Training (FET) to the Board
 - Reports from the Chief Executive, Director of OSD, Director of FET, Director of Schools and Head of Finance, to the Audit and Risk Committee
 - o Recommendations made by the C & AG in management letters or other reports
 - o Recommendations made by the Internal Audit Unit
 - o Risk Management Reports from DOSD/Chief Risk Officer
 - The Risk Register that is kept up-to-date and presented to the Audit and Risk Committee on a regular basis.

Report for presentation to the Houses of the Oireachtas

Opinion on the financial statements

I have audited the financial statements of Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board for the year ended 31 December 2021 as required under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. The financial statements comprise

- · the statement of accounting policies
- · the operating statement
- the statement of current assets and current liabilities, and
- the related notes.

In my opinion,

- the financial statements properly present the income and expenditure of the Board for 2021 and the state of affairs of the Board at 31 December 2021, and
- the financial statements are in accordance with the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education.

Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit of the financial statements in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) as promulgated by the International Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions. My responsibilities under those standards are described in the appendix to this report. I am independent of Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board and have fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the standards.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Report on information other than the financial statements, and on other matters

The Board has presented certain other information together with the financial statements. This comprises the statement of Board responsibilities, the statement on the system of internal control, and a schedule of activities and pay costs. My responsibilities to report in relation to such information, and on certain other matters upon which I report by exception, are described in the appendix to this report.

Non-effective expenditure on a leased unit

The Board has disclosed in the statement on internal control that it exited the lease of a premises in 2022. The ten-year lease commenced in 2017, and the premises had been rented under a licence agreement prior to this. The premises was intended to become a training centre. Fitout expenses were incurred, and some training was delivered. However, the premises was reviewed and was considered unsuitable for further development. The Board incurred costs totaling €848,000 in the period 2015 to 2022 in respect of the premises. As the building had not been used for the planned purpose, the Board's expenditure on rent and other related costs was ineffective.

Report of the C&AG (continued)

Non-compliance with procurement rules

The statement on internal control discloses that in 2021 the Board incurred significant expenditure where the procedures followed did not comply with public procurement guidelines. The statement also sets out the steps taken or planned by the Board to address this matter.

 I identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements whether due to fraud or error; design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks; and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

If, based on the work I have performed, I conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, I am required to report that fact.

My audit is conducted by reference to the special considerations which attach to State bodies in relation to their management and operation. I report if I identify material matters relating to the manner in which public business has been conducted.

I seek to obtain evidence about the regularity of financial transactions in the course of audit. I report if I identify any material instance where public money has not been applied for the purposes intended or where transactions did not conform to the authorities governing them.

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board Notes to The Financial Statements - Year Ended 31 December 2021

1 Accounting Policies

1.1 Significant Accounting Policies

The basis of accounting and significant accounting policies adopted by KWETB are set out below. They have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.2 General Information

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 and its functions are set out in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Community National Schools came under the Patronage of the ETB with the commencement of the 2016/2017 academic year.

1.3 (a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education with the consent of the Minister for Finance and Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of an Operating Statement, a Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities and notes to the Financial Statements including Accounting Policies.

(b) Revenue and Expenditure Recognition

Revenue

Oireachtas grants and other grants are recognised on a cash basis.

Other receipts are recognised on a cash basis.

Expenditure

Pav

Pay expenditure is recognised on a cash basis. Pay represents renumeration to employees including ER PRSI.

Non Pay

Non Pay expenditure is recognised on a cash basis. Non pay expenditure is comprised of administration and operational expenses.

Allowances

Allowance expenditure is recognised on a cash basis. Allowances are paid to learners who are undertaking specified further education and training programmes funded by SOLAS.

The Operating Statement is presented by cash receipts and cash payments per programme grouping. The cash surplus / (deficit) is adjusted for movement in Current Assets (excl. Bank) and Current Liabilities to give an overall result for the year on an accrual basis.

(c) Asset and Liabilities Recognition

The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accruals basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related receipts received and expenditure incurred and in accordance with the funding rules.

Recurrent State Grants

These grants constitute the core funding to the Education and Training Board.

Capital Grants

These grants are used to meet building, infrastructure, property acquisitions and refurbishment costs, and in specified circumstances may be used to fund fixtures, fittings, equipment and furniture.

Other Recurrent Income

Agency and Self - financing Projects

Agency work involves running a programme on behalf of another organisation or students according to agreed criteria and the Board is reimbursed its cost.

Self - financing Projects are programmes run under the complete control of the Board either for the Board or other organisations.

Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets.

Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current Liabilities.

Comparatives

Where necessary, the comparative figures for the previous year have been restated on the same basis as those for the current year.

1 Accounting Policies (continued)

(d) Tangible fixed assets

All tangible fixed assets purchased including building, infrastructure, property acquisitions, refurbishment costs, fixtures, fittings, equipment and furniture are expensed in the year of purchase. State grants to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are recognised in the same year.

(e) Stocks

All consumable stocks are expensed as purchased.

(f) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS, are conferred under defined benefit schemes. Staff employed since 2013 are included in the Single Public Service Pension Scheme and monthly payments are made to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of the schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding, or paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

The ETB does not make any contributions towards the schemes.

These unfunded schemes are operated on a pay as you go basis with the annual pension entitlements being paid directly by the National Shared Services Office on behalf of the ETB. ETBs are responsible for the administration of their pensions. Pension funds are provided by the Department of Education.

Provision has not been made in the financial statements for the present cost of the future benefits that have accrued to staff members and existing pensioners under these schemes.

(g) Leases

All lease payments are expensed as incurred.

Actual receipts of Retained Superannuation Contributions were €2,993,736, which is €24,244 less than anticipated. This shortfall of €24,244 will be funded by the Department of Education in the 2022 Pay Grant.

c Non Pay

Department of Education: Post-Primary Schools and Head Office Non Pay Grant was funded by direct receipts from grantor of €4,606,331, forecasted locally raised receipts of €60,000. 33 Contingencies

At the date of approval of these financial statements the following contingencies are noted: In March 2022 High Courts actions by one person against KWETB were heard and found in favour of KWETB. The appellant is now seeking leave of the Supreme Court to hear her case. Consequently the appelant is seeking leave for the Supreme Court to overturn the awarding of costs by the High Court against her. KWETB won an Isaac Wunder Order against the Person and she is now appealing this decision and the awarding of costs to the Court of Appeal. These matters involve both KWETB and Minister for Education and are evolving.

34 Additional Superannuation Contribution

The ETB does not make pension contributions in respect of employees. Since 2013 all new entrants are obliged to join the Single Public Pension Scheme.

From 1 January 2019 onwards, members of public service defined benefit pension schemes pay an additional superannuation contribution (ASC) arising from the Public Service Stability Agreement (2018-2020) and the Public Service Pay and Pensions Act 2017. ASC is a permanent contribution in respect of pensionable remuneration.

The ETB deducted Additional Superannuation Contributions from employees amounting to €2,687,420 (2020 €2,499,194) which were remitted to the Department of Education.

35 Retirement Benefit costs

During 2021 a pilot project was undertaken in three ETB's to estimate the cost of retirement benefit obligations. The Department is currently considering the outcome of this pilot with a view to rolling the project out on a phased basis to all ETB's.

36 Write - Offs

In 2021 sanction was given by Department of Public Expenditure and Reform to the National Shared Services Office (NSSO) who act as payroll providers for ETB pensioner payments to write off overpayments to the value of €250 for individual deceased pensioners on the Superannuation Scheme/Schemes.

In 2021, €596 was written off on behalf of KWETB.

37 Annual Contribution to Education and Training Boards Ireland.

41 The Impact of COVID 19

The COVID 19 pandemic developed rapidly in 2020 and its impact has continued throughout 2021. Measures taken by our government to contain the virus continued to affect how we operate. KWETB has taken a range of measures to monitor and mitigate the effects of COVID 19 including putting in place required safety and public health measures for our staff such as social distancing and working from home. Notwithstanding the impact of COVID 19, KWETB continues to carry out its vital role in education and training with a focus on ensuring continuity of education for learners, including a particular focus on more vulnerable students.

Since March 2020 the pandemic has had financial implications for KWETB and we have received additional resources in the form of government grants to assist us in continuing in our role.

In 2021 we received the following additional COVID 19 related funding

- Department of Education COVID 19 Operational supports for a full return to school- €2,041,563
- Department of Education COVID 19 Additional Supervision Arrangements €1,231,882
- Department of Education Calculated Grades Aides €59,797
- SOLAS COVID 19 FET overheads €31,112
- Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth Youth Services €41,582
- Increased Student access suppport Mitigating Educational Disadvantage Fund (MEADF) etc, €159,189

This additional grant assistance provided funding across a range of areas of expenditure arising from the pandemic such as:

- Cleaning support
- Hand sanitiser and PPE
- Enhanced Supervision Support
- · Minor Works including classroom reconfiguration
- Additional Short term COVID related leases
- · Software licences and IT equipment
- Calculated Grades Aides

The additional costs incurred were partially offset by savings in the areas of

- Substitution Costs
- Travel and Subsistence
- Savings associated with the delivery of Further Education and Training provision, including apprenticeships, where allowances would normally be paid to learners but where prolonged centre closures meant some classes did not take place as scheduled and there was a drop in learner payments.

On 10/12/2021, KWETB refunded the Department of Education unspent COVID 19 funding of €708,229

KWETB has taken the following steps to manage and mitigate the effects of the pandemic on its operation:

- KWETB engaged its business continuity plan to ensure that its operations continued as normal in line with it regulatory requirements.
- The Audit and Risk Committee reviewed the updated risk register to take account of the specific risks arising from COVID 19 and KWETB developed and implemented additional control measures as required.
- The Department of Education and Further and Higher Education, Research Innovation and Science put in place a range of steering and engagement structures to support the education and training system in pavigating the challenges of COVID 19. KWETB is participating
- engagement structures to support the education and training system in navigating the challenges of COVID 19. KWETB is participating
 in these structures to ensure a joined-up approach across the education sector.

In 2022 we will continue to follow the various government policies and advice and, in parallel, we will do our utmost to continue our vital role in the best and safest way possible. Within the further education and training sector, ETBs will continue to play an important role in the response to upskilling and reskilling those adversely impacted by the pandemic.
